NOTICE FOR ORAL HEARING

Subject: Oral hearing in Safeguard (Quantitative Restrictions) investigation concerning imports of “Isopropyl Alcohol” into India.

A Safeguard (QR) investigation on import of “Isopropyl Alcohol” into India was initiated on 04.11.2019 under the Customs Tariff (Identification and Assessment of Safeguard Duty) Rules, 1997 (Safeguard Rules) and Safeguard Measures (Quantitative Restrictions) Rules, 2012. As per Rule 6 (6) of the QR Rules *“The Designated Authority may allow an interested party or its representative to present the information relevant to the investigation orally but such oral information shall be taken into consideration by the Designated Authority only when it is subsequently submitted in writing”*.

2 In pursuance of the aforesaid provision, and the prevailing Covid-19 pandemic, the Designated Authority has scheduled an oral hearing in the matter through Digital Video Conference (DVC) on **28th May 2020 at 3.30 PM (IST)**.

3. The technical details for participation in the DVC are attached any interested party may participate in the oral hearing in case they wish to present such information relevant to the investigation.

**Technical Details for participation in the DVC pertaining to Safeguard (OR)
investigation concerning imports of "Isopropyl Alcohol" into India on 28/5/2020 at
15.30 Hrs. (IST).**

1. The Digital Video conference (DVC) has been organised keeping in view the Covid-19 situation as is also mentioned in the Trade Notice 01/2020 dated 10.04.2020, uploaded on DGTR's website <http://www.dgtr.gov.in/sites/default/files/Trade%20Notice%20Covid%2019.pdf>.
2. To keep the participation manageable through digital mode, the number of participants of any interested party is restricted to two including the legal representative/coordinator. However, in cases where an interested party may require additional persons to participate, the Authority may permit one additional participant for which request should be sent at least 24 hours in advance.
3. Any interested party may participate in the Video Conference through the following two modes:
 - (a) Static IP: Static IP of the party should be shared with DGTR at least 24 hours prior to the start of the oral hearing
 - (b) Web link: DGTR would be providing web link, to enable the interested parties to participate through web room (WR) mode. The interested party should confirm its participation at least 24 hours in advance. The interested parties would need to click on the link provided to join the video conference.
4. An interested party should provide name of the organisation/company, mobile No., and landline No, (with country/state code) and email of the participating legal representative/coordinator at the email address adgl1-dgtr@gov.in, and jd12-dgtr@gov.in. Those interested parties who wish to join through static IP address may provide the IP address also. For such interested parties the IP address provided by NIC would be shared with them along with a password through email.
5. To participate in the video conferencing through Web Room, please download the application 'Vidyo' for joining the video conference through mobile/desktop. In case of any difficulty to join the video conference though 'Vidyo', copy and paste the link on Internet Explorer/Chrome to join the video conference. 6. The Directorate would share the weblink with the coordinator/legal representative of the interested party prior to the oral hearing who may share it further with their other permitted participants.

7. Since oral submissions are to be subsequently reproduced in writing by each interested party after the oral hearing, the interested parties are requested to be brief and restrict their oral submissions to key aspects only.

8. In case any participants joining the DVC, is unable to complete his/her submission for any technical reason, he/she may file written submission which will be taken on record. Further, all written submissions will be shared amongst all participating interested parties as per the usual practice so as to enable all interested parties to file rejoinders. The time schedule for written submissions and rejoinders will be informed during the oral hearing.

9. The concerned Embassies/Country representative offices in India are requested to encourage/facilitate participation of the interested parties from their country in the oral hearing through DVC.
